New Missalette and Hymnal for 2024

You will notice starting next week for the First Sunday of Advent St. Edward's will have a new resource for our Missalette and Hymnal. There are some factors taken into consideration for this change. I want to explain them for your benefit.

First with the fire at St. Edward's our books that we had at the church would not be fit for use any longer due to smoke damage. Second, while we are worshiping at St. Mary's, we have the Seasonal Missalette to use as well as the Gather 3rd Edition hard-cover hymnal. I understand that it is less than desirable to handle two books. Third, we are not using the TV screens as we do not have someone to operate them. Fourth, with the accompaniment books being lost at St. Edward's, I did not have music that correlates to the music in the

different.

To help remedy some of the issues we are facing, we have decided to pursue an all-in-one resource for the time being. The book is called Breaking Bread from OCP (Oregon Catholic Press). Some of the benefits of this book include:

Missalette (sometimes the translations or words are

- *Missalette and Hymnal in one book format.
- *Printed once per year to save shipping costs.
- *Soft cover (not so heavy)
- *Service Music that we use for Psalm and Gospel is what we use currently so music readers can follow.
- *Has most music we already know, brings old favorites back, and provides many new options to us.

*Temporary solution: We will be able to bring books to Elmdale when the church opens up. Also not as expensive as hard-cover books at this time giving us the opportunity to re-evaluate options in future. (Though hard covers are more cost-effective in the long-run.)

*This book or books with similar music from the same publisher are in other local parishes: Holdingford, Swanville, St. Mary's in LF, Sauk Centre, others...
As for the St. Mary's Community, since they generally use the TV screens, they may already be using music from this book or the current books we have, and they are not beholden to one publisher with their OneLicense options. If you have questions, please let me know. Michael Retka, 320-232-5898.

Notes from Fr. Jimmy

Feast of the Immaculate Conception: Dec. 8, Friday

On December 8, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which references Mary's conception in her mother's womb without the stain of Original Sin. Since Blessed Virgin Mary is the Patroness of the United States, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception is the Patronal Feast Day of our Country and it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Advent

We are entering into the powerful season of Advent, a season to prepare with awe and gratitude for the Feast of the Incarnation of Jesus, born to us as our Lord and Savior. A season to prepare for His return at the end of time. It is also a moment to remind ourselves that our individual judgment day is coming, the moment when we will be called to give an account for all the love God has shown us and the gifts He has given us during our lifetime. We need this Advent to pray for strength. The Holy Spirit has taught the Church that to prepare for Christ, we must: *Pray the Holy Mass with so much love that Mass, the Eucharist becomes the center of our lives. Thus, we have the word, "Christ-Mass." The Catechism of the Catholic Church No. 2181 teaches us: "The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin."

- *Be immersed in repentance and express this by Advent Confession.
- *Abide in God's word and share His word. This is the origin of Christmas cards.
- *Do penance, especially fasting. This is the connotation of the Advent color, purple.
- *Do good deeds, especially almsgiving. This is the origin of Christmas gift-giving.

Christ is coming in a new way this Christmas. Let us not deny that Greatest Gift. I wish and pray that you all have a Blessed Advent that will lead us to a Joyful Christmas! Fr. Jimmy
