

Notes from Father David

Each year, the Church celebrates this holiest of weeks with reverence and awe. We stand before the Lord Jesus, who suffered and died to save us from our sins. We are overwhelmed by this great act of love that brings us new life to all who call out to God in faith. As we begin his Holy Week, we pledge our prayerful support and love, for the journey that is ahead of you involves embracing the cross of Christ in a deeper way.

With Holy Week upon us, many graces available when you come to Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please note the individual times offered in our parishes. It was most beautiful how so many parents, children and youth came to Jesus March 22 for our Religious Education Confessions! No doubt the Holy Spirit is touching our families. No matter how long it has been since your last confession or how you were once treated unkindly by a priest, please come back to Jesus. God wants to bless you this Easter with special graces.

<u>Holy Thursday</u> begins the three-day remembrance of the Passion, Crucifixion, and Resurrection of the Lord. We remember how Jesus' life on earth ended – in triumph disguised as defeat. Everything that He has done has led to this point: his forty days alone in the desert, resisting the temptation of the devil; preaching, teaching, and healing in a revolutionary way, which captivated the people but threatened the authorities; gathering close friends who would carry His mission on. Instead of foot washing for our two Masses, you will be invited to bring food items for those in need. There will be boxes in the entrances of our churches which then will be brought forward at offertory. Food items will make their way to Food Shelves in Little Falls or Holdingford.

<u>Good Friday</u> the cross is at the center of our worship. Christ died in order to set us free from our sin. As you continue to prepare to become closer to Christ, ponder the mysteries of the cross. Pope Francis has asked all parishes to support the Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land, where they are now less than 2% of the population. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection helps to preserve the sacred shrines of Christianity, including Jerusalem, Nazareth, and Bethlehem, to name only a few. The pandemic hit Christians in the Holy Land particularly hard. Most of them depend on pilgrimages for work. In these times of crisis, this collection is necessary to meet the basic needs of the People of God still living in this Land and maintain a Christian presence where the Church was born. When we contribute, we join with Catholics around the world united with the Church in the Holy Land.

<u>The Easter Vigil</u> is like none other, with the lighting and the blessing of the Easter fire, a symbol of light emerging from the darkness, of warmth radiating through the cold, of life triumphing over death. We will bless new Easter candles for St Edward's and St Francis. That evening our three parishes keep vigil around this holy fire, gathered in glorious expectation of new life: new life in Sally Hansen as she receives the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, new life in the renewal of our own baptismal promises, new life in the resurrection of our Lord. Afterwards, please join us in our church basement at St Edward's as we celebrate Sally coming into our Catholic faith with some refreshments!
