

St. Edward's News

History of Elmdale

Catholic pioneers who settled in the area of southwestern Morrison County in the early 1870's traveled to Holy Cross parish, North Prairie, for religious services. Sometimes during this period, a visiting priest offered Mass in the home to Frank Kalis, Sr., for the Catholic people of this area. In 1881 five acres of land were purchased from Nicholas Boos for eight dollars. Immediately the Catholic men of the area constructed a log church, measuring 20 by 30 feet, and lined it with willows and lime plaster. In 1882, Father Edward Nagl, pastor of the North Prairie parish, blessed it and served as its first pastor. In honor of him the parish was given St. Edward as its patron.

As time passed, the original church became too small to serve the needs of the growing community which was being cared for as a mission of Royalton. In 1920 a delegation of men petitioned Bishop Busch for permission to build a new church. Members of this delegation were Lawrence Ohotto, John Sobiech, Anton Jendro, Frank Czech, Frank Kalis and Charles Retka. With his approval the project was undertaken under the direction of Father Augus Plachta, pastor of Royalton, by the 28 families who made up the parish.

The men of the parish supplied most of the labor in building the \$40,000 church which was constructed of granite stones and bricks. Most to the materials were hauled by teams of horses from Bowlus. Father Anthony Lamusga became the first resident pastor. The present rectory, costing \$12,000, was built in 1928 under the supervision of the pastor, Father Theodore Wrobel.
